It would not be wrong to argue that desire found expression mostly through visual means in the 19th century. As an Ottoman-European city, Istanbul was not only an object of desire, but also reproduced the desire to look and be looked at, a condition of modern life, in its own space. For this reason, the arrival of cinema in the city and the penetration of modernity into its fabric should be considered together.

He co-edited with Ebru Kayaalp *Exploring Past Images in a Digital Age: Reinventing the Archive* which came out from Amsterdam University Pres in 2023.
